


HOW DID SAINT VALENTINE'S DAY BEGIN?

Valentine, my heart is yours And always will be, too. Because you're very special-And I think the world of you!




Cultural note on Easter

In Britain and the U.S., Easter is associated with eggs, lambs, daffodils and rabbits (bunnies). People give each other cards decorated with these Easter symbols and chocolate eggs or chocolate rabbits. Children often have an Easter egg 'treasure hunt'. Parents hide Easter eggs around the house and garden and children have a race to find as many eggs as they can. A traditional Easter food in Britain is a 'hot cross bun', this is like a sweet bread roll with a cross on top of it which reminds us of the death of Jesus on the cross. In the U.S. children believe that eggs are brought by the Easter bunny. In Washington, D.C., children gather outside the White House for an Easter Egg Roll. They have to roll hard-boiled eggs down a slope and the first egg to reach the bottom without breaking is the winner. Easter is also a time when people like to put on new clothes and there are special Easter parades in
