the fishmonger in fish,

the florist in flowers,

the newsagent in newspapers and magazines,

the men's wear and women's wear in clothes and dresses,

the lingerie in underwear,

the draper in cloths and bed-clothes,

the wine-merchant in alcoholic drinks of all kinds, the ironmonger in metal goods (tools, pots, pans, nails etc.),

the dairy sells milk products and eggs,

the stationary sells paper products and office supplies,

the jeweller sells jewellery, ....

the toyshop sells various toys for children (dolls, teddies),

the delicatessen sells some exclusive and more expensive food,

the electrical applicances shop sells TV and radio sets, fridges etc.
